

PENALTY POINT SYSTEM

The Bermuda Junior Golf Association takes great pride in the quality of its program and players. In order to continue a program of excellence the Association requires that all of its members adhere to the Code of Conduct. In order to ensure compliance with the Code of Conduct, the following penalty point system has been developed.

YELLOW CARD

A yellow card will be issued by the BJGA as a penalty if a junior displays any of the following:

- walking off the course without permission of a BJGA official
- not finishing a round due to “just cause” as determined by the Board
- use of un-approved electronic devices on the golf course
- throwing or breaking golf equipment
- swearing
- poor attitude
- dress code violation
- poor etiquette
- use or association with drugs or alcohol, smoking or chewing tobacco products

RED CARD

A red card will be issued by the BJGA as a penalty if a junior displays any of the following:

- cheating
- insolence
- physical and/or verbal abuse or the treat thereof to others
- fighting
- damage to property
- stealing

If a junior receives 1 YELLOW CARD; the player, at the discretion of the BJGA, may be given a one week suspension from weekly play.

If a junior receives 1 RED CARD or 2 YELLOW CARDS; the player, at the discretion of the BJGA, will be given a two week suspension from weekly play, and not be allowed to play in the next local major tournament.

If a junior receives 2 RED CARDS or 4 YELLOW CARDS; the player, at the discretion of the BJGA, may be disqualified from representing the BJGA in golf schools or any tournaments.

If a junior receives 3 RED CARDS or 6 YELLOW CARDS; the player, at the discretion of the BJGA, may be expelled from the BJGA program.

All cards accumulate during each year, September 1st through August 31st and will be a permanent part of your records.
