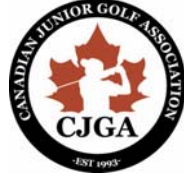
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ABOUT THE CANADIAN JUNIOR GOLF ASSOCIATION

Teams: The CJGA Tournament Committee has invited several top federations from around the world to represent their country at the Canadian International Junior Challenge. The following federations have confirmed their attendance at this year's event:

Age Requirement: Four boys aged 18 or under (as of September 16th, 2008)

Player Deadline: Teams must submit its players no later the September 1st.

Form of Play: Three rounds of stroke play. The three best scores from each team will count towards the team total for each competitive round. The team with the lowest total at the end of the event will be declared the winner of the Canadian International Junior Challenge. The medallist will also be recognized.

Meals: Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided by the CJGA during the practice and tournament rounds. The locations of meals are outlined in the Schedule of Events section. All other meals will be at the federation's expense.

Transportation: Transportation during the team's stay will be at the federation's expense. The CJGA has arranged rental vans for each team however each team will be responsible for the payment of the rentals. Van pick ups will be available at Pearson International Airport in Toronto.



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Flights: All flights should be booked into Pearson International Airport (YYZ) in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Flight costs will be at the participating federation's expense. Teams must provide their flight info to the Tournament Director no later than September 1st, 2008.

Accommodation: The CJGA is pleased to announce that this year's accommodation will be provided by the Blue Mountain Inn. Located in the heart of the Village at Blue Mountain, the Blue Mountain Inn provides guests with the convenience of indoor travel to resort dining and located minutes from the Village at Blue Mountain, the Blue Mountain Inn consists of 90+ comfortable guestrooms.
