



2011 Ross 'Blackie' Talbot Junior International Classic Code of Conduct

Violations of Code of Conduct

- Unsportsmanlike conduct, including abusive language, cheating, club throwing, disrespect to volunteers, officials or fellow competitors, or abuse of golf course property
- Not adhering to the dress code at host golf course
- Use or association with drugs or alcohol, smoking or chewing tobacco products
- Vandalism at host hotel, abusive behavior to host family or property
- Conduct not becoming of an Junior Golfer, such as acting in anger or creating other distractions
- Physical abuse, threat of physical abuse or verbal abuse to other players, parents, host golf course staff or members, Tournament staff or volunteers is grounds for immediate dismissal.

Attire

- Proper attire is required at all times at the host golf course, including cookouts.
- The Tournament Committee will review questionable attire.
- Tucker's Point Club's and The Mid Ocean Club's Dress Code takes precedence. (See Conditions of Play)
- Players in violation will not be allowed to tee off.
- There is no required dress code for Players Registration and opening reception but it is expected that players be dressed appropriately in casual attire.

Player Registration

- Players are required to attend the Players Registration and Opening reception.

Code of Conduct Violation Penalties

Any Code of Conduct violation will result in a written letter to the player and his or her parent/guardian.

The Tournament Committee may assess any or all of the following penalties based on severity and frequency of the violation(s):

- One-stroke penalty for each act of unsportsmanlike behavior on the golf course.
- Immediate disqualification from the tournament at which the violation occurs.
